Lining the pockets of the world's billionaires. The very top of the economic pyramid sees trillions of dollars of wealth in the hands of a very small group of people, predominantly men, whose fortune and power grow exponentially. Billionaires have now more wealth than the 4.6 billion people who make up 60 percent of the planet's population. Meanwhile, around 735 million people are still living in extreme poverty. Many others are just one hospital bill or failed harvest away from slipping into it.

More than 300 million children of primary education age are not in school and 759 million young people (14+) adults are illiterate and do not have the awareness necessary to improve both their living conditions and those of their children - as a result of lack of education.

Denied a longer life. In most countries having money is a passport to better health and a longer life, while being poor all too often means more sickness and an earlier grave. People from poor communities can expect to die ten or twenty years earlier than people in wealthy areas. In developing countries, a child from a poor family is twice as likely to die before the age of five than a child from a rich family.



Closer to Home...

- There were **4.3 million children** living in poverty in the UK in 2019-20.¹ That's 31 per cent of children, or **nine in a classroom of 30**.²
- 49 per cent of children living in **lone-parent families** are in poverty.³ Lone parents face a higher risk of poverty due to the lack of an additional earner, low rates of maintenance payments, gender inequality in employment and pay, and childcare costs.
- Children from **Black and minority ethnic groups** are more likely to be in poverty: 46 per cent are now in poverty, compared with 26 per cent of children in White British families.⁴
- Work does not provide a guaranteed route out of poverty in the UK. 75 per cent of children growing up in poverty live in a **household where at least one person works**.⁵
- Children in **larger families** are at a far greater risk of living in poverty – 47 per cent of children living in families with 3 or more children live in poverty.⁶
- Childcare and housing are two of the costs that take the biggest toll on families' budgets.



Summary

Extreme inequality is out of control. Hundreds of millions of people are living in extreme poverty while huge rewards go to those at the very top. There are more billionaires than ever before, and their fortunes have grown to record levels. Meanwhile, the world's poorest get even poorer.
