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Poppins Play Is Practically Perfect

Most people will have seen, or at least heard of, the Disney classic film 'Mary Poppins' which is Glossopdale schools' latest production. It has been yet another huge success, with evenings fully booked and praise from all around. But, what exactly does it take to make an outstanding show? And what is it like to be part of the cast?

With auditions starting as early as January, crafting the show was no small feat. Rehearsals were a weekly commitment, lasting up to three hours. With song practise, line learning, later prop building, and finally mic checks. With the shows starting in March, there was little time to waste; Costumes had to be fitted, and a backstage crew was organised to keep everything in check because, although it may not seem like it to the audience, behind the scenes there is a constant bustle of activity; from ensemble rushing for costume changes to characters waiting in the wings, the space behind the curtain is never empty. But the most amazing part is that all of this backstage action takes place in almost complete silence, unseen and unheard by the audience.

Unlike the rush in the wings, onstage there is a different story being told; an extremely scripted story, the lines have been committed to the memories of various characters over many rehearsals. We talked to several of these 'characters' to get their experiences from being in some of the main roles:

'I've definitely grown in confidence and in character since I started acting' shared Erin Bryson, who played the leading role of Mary Poppins, raising her voice over the excited hubbub of intermission. When asked what inspired her to start acting, she replied; 'I find the performance aspect really interesting; it's fun and gives you a lot of adrenaline.' – A similar answer to another of our interviewees, Rhys White (Michael Banks), who responded, 'My drama lessons are very fun and I decided I would like to try for it (the role).' He also added that he was encouraged into auditioning by his friends and when asked about how he found the audiences whilst performing, he said that the final audience was the most enthusiastic, but that no matter which audience he performed to, he never felt any more nervous. One thing that our interviewees agreed on was that they are all looking forward to participating in future shows.

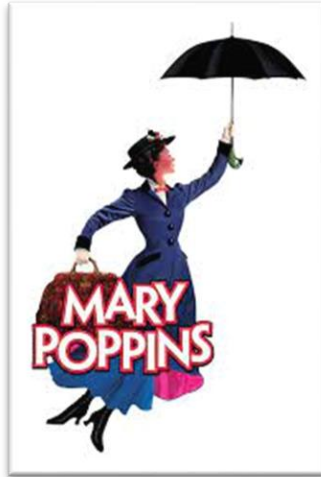
So, although creating the show was time-consuming and involved masses of hard work and patience, it was all worth it in the end and turned out to be a very valuable experience for the whole cast.

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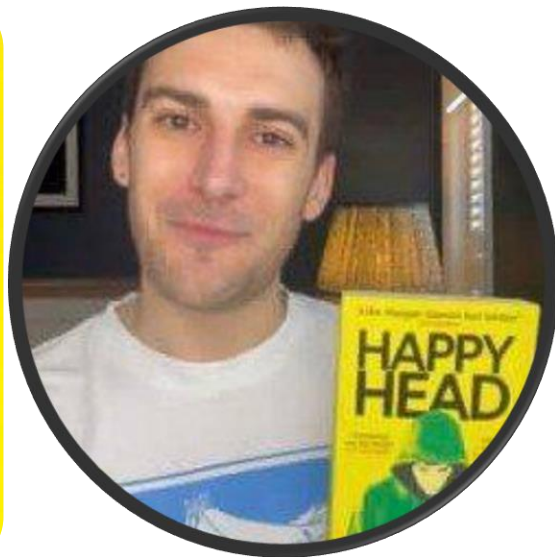
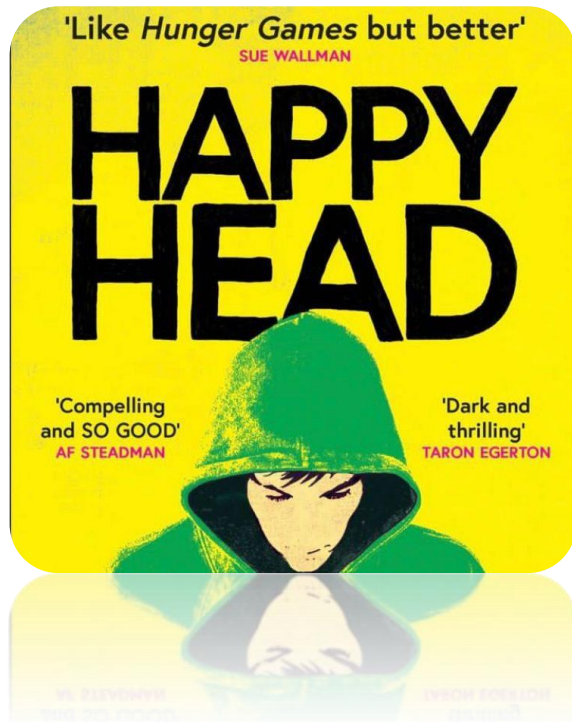
Mary Poppins School Production

Students particularly enjoyed our Spaghetti Tower and Silent Debate challenges!



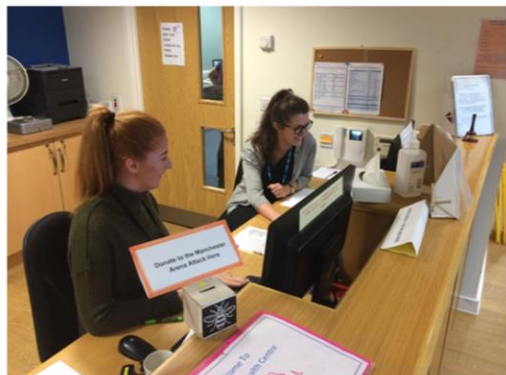
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Work Experience

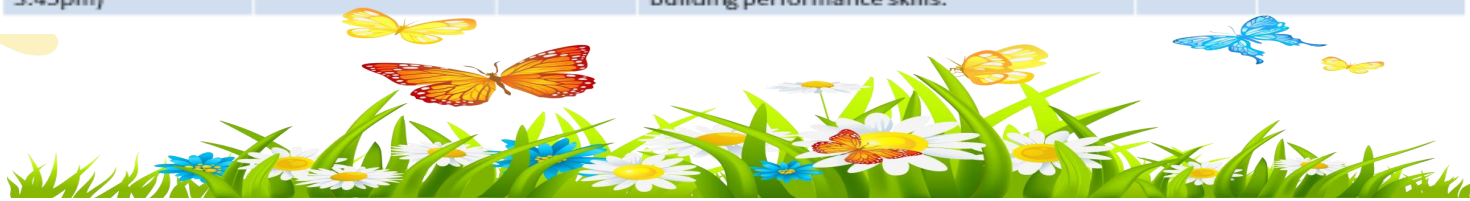

The qualifying expedition took place this week and students had to navigate from Hayfield to Edale, then onto Calver for day 2. Day 3 routes took them to Bakewell via Chatsworth House. Not wanting to waste an opportunity to revise the Year 11 team selected a team project that complimented their GCSE Geography revision. They spent their time looking at the impact of human behaviour on the physical landscape, while the year 10 teams had the challenge of creating amazing landscape photographs or capturing native Peak District species such as the Curlew and Lapwing. 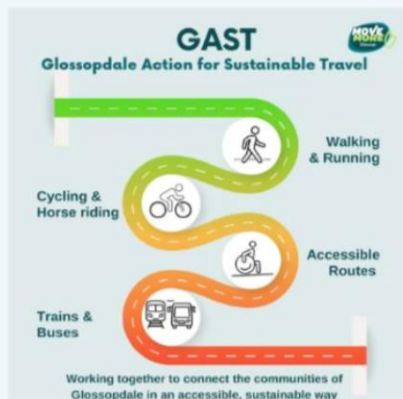
